6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

#### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Curricula are designed and developed at the University level, so the scope of Innovative curricular designing is limited. The college follows and implements the syllabus it. However, HODs of the affiliating colleges are members of the Board of Studies in their respective subjects.

The heads of various departments of this College have actively participated on curriculum design, its development and revision process of University of Jammu. Semester system has been introduced from the current session at the undergraduate level.

- Academic calendar of the college is prepared in the beginning of the session.
- ICT enabled advanced methods are used for teaching and learning in the college.
- The college organizes seminars, guest lectures, quiz contests, workshops.
- The departments of the college conduct unit tests, group discussions and home assignments etc.
- Field study, subject tours, Symposium, Project work and dissertation work carried out by most departments of the College for giving latest trends in teaching and research and for creating interest and enthusiasm among the students.
- Exposing students for outdoor learning through educational trips, camps etc.
- Motivating students for research activities.
- Special coaching and remedial classes for weaker students are carried out to bring up the backward students to the forefront.
- The College supplements the lecture method by other learning/teaching methods such as interactive method, demonstration method, use of charts and models, group discussions and use of computers.
- Efforts are made to involve the students in these activities to develop the innovative thinking of the students.
- Faculty development programmes through seminars, workshops, summer schools and university/College leadership development programmes and participation of teachers in general orientation and subject refresher courses.

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The University examinations and evaluations are managed by the University of Jammu, however, college conducts examination as per the rules and regulations of the University of Jammu. The evaluation is done at University of Jammu on Table by the university and college teachers.

Internal Examinations are conducted as per the instructions of the University of Jammu. The college has adopted the centralized examination system for conduct of Internal Assessments.

General strategies are developed by the University but principals of the affiliating colleges can suggest improvement in the existing system.

- (a) Teachers are kept updated about available scopes for applying for research grants.
- (b) Space and necessary infrastructural support is provided for research work.
- (c) College has a research committee for promotion of research and development.
- (d) Research Journals have also been subscribed for the teacher/researchers.
- (e) College has organised seminars, symposiums and workshops.
- (f) UGC sponsored research projects are in operation, the faculty also contributes in their respective fields through books and research papers.
- (g) Research journals have also been subscribed for the teacher/researchers.

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- Library is monitored by the Library Committee, IQAC and Administration on routine basis.

- Organised Book Exhibitions to encourage reading habits among students and other stake holders.

- Continued subscription of N-List Programme of INFLIBNET through which e-books and e-Journal are accessed.
- Internet service has been made available to the library users.
- Annual budgetary allocation is made available to each department for purchasing equipment, text books and reference books each year.

- Physical Infrastructure of the college has been enriched/upgraded.
- Proposal for CCTV cameras has been submitted.
- Laboratories have been renovated.
- Proposal for construction of Bathrooms for handicap students is submitted to UGC.
- Proposal for construction of two PG departments has been submitted under RMSA scheme.

#### **ICT (Information and Communication Technology)**

- ICT resources has been extended to all stakeholders.
- College has utilized UGC as well as Govt. of J&K Grants for enriching ICT resources.
- Proposals for smart classrooms and language laboratory has been submitted.

#### INSTRUMENTATION

- All labs are upgraded by procuring new instruments like microscopes, computer etc.
- Proposals for setting up of Research Labs. has been submitted under RMSA scheme.

As proposal for FIST Level-0 has been approved by the Department of Sciences & Technology, and an amount of Rs. 1 (one) crore has been sanction in favour of GDC Rajouri, the college is going to purchase instruments of Rs. 50 Lacs

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The college manages human resources in the following manners:

- The human resource of the college is managed in a democratic manner.
- The college has a Student's Union whose elections are held annually.
- The Teacher's Council and the Non-Teaching Staff Association look after the affairs of the teaching and non-teaching staff respectively.
- Also, the Teachers remain available even outside the Class either in the Library or in the Staff Room for the Student counselling.
- Moreover, College has a Grievance Redressal Cell, Carrier and Counseling Cell, Suggestion Box, Placement Cell, Discipline Committee, Anti Ragging Committee, Women Development Cell, Health Centre, etc.

#### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

The permanent Faculty and all other Staff is appointed by Govt. of Jammu & Kashmir through JKPSC and JKSSRB. Moreover, contractual staff is also appointed by the Govt. of Jammu and Kashmir.

Only Local Fund Employees are appointed by the college on need basis. College has Local Fund Committee comprising of eight Senior Faculty Members which recommends for appointment of new Local Fund Employee on meritbasis. The college administration finally makes new appointment of Local Fund.

- The college has established linkage with the neighbouring industries.
- The Students are using the linkage for doing their project works.
- Guest speakers from industries and other institutions have been invited.
- Field visits and industrial visits of students are organized.
- Collaboration made with industries and other noted institutions to organize seminars and workshops.
- The college is in collaboration with the Department of wild life.

#### 6.3.9 Admission of Students

The college follows rules & regulations of affiliating University and Government of J&K in the admission process.

#### **UG Courses:**

• Admission in UG Courses is done by college.

- Admission is made strictly on the basis of merit. However, the students belonging to different reserved categories like SC, ST, ALC and RBA get additional weightage of 5% marks at the time of admission.
- The College ensures publicity to the admission process by advertising in regional news papers, prospectus, College website, local Cable TV Channels'

• Transparency is ensured in the admission process from the stage of notification till the completion of admission process.

- The Principal and Conveners of the admission committee, along with the members of the committees of various streams is part of the selection process.
- The counselling team helps the students to make the choice of the stream and subjects.
- College follows reservation policy of the government in admission also.
- The College gives prospectus at the time of admission to students from where students know the information about fees structure, student support, etc.

#### **PG COURSES**

Admission in PG Courses viz. M. Sc Chemistry and Master of Computer Applications (MCA) is done through an Entrance test conducted by the University of Jammu. However, HOD's of PG Departments attend counselling of students who qualifies for admission to MCA and M.Sc. Chemistry.

- The college has made arrangements for the parking of the vehicles of the staff and students in the college ground in a separate place. This helps in keeping the campus clean to a greater extent.
- The dead leaves and the waste papers are not allowed to be put on fire. The leaves are buried in the soil itself and the papers are disposed off.

#### Annexure of 7.2

#### Goal

The main objective of the institution is to transform the students into well meaning citizens through the committed pattern of instructions based on carefully prepared and well designed curricular aspects. The changing needs of the time are the basis while building a rich corpus of talent. Hence, the main objective of Govt. Degree College Rajouri is to transform the students into well meaning citizens through well prepared socially committed patterns of instruction.

The College aspires to have a transformational impact on students through comprehensive education by inculcating qualities of competence, confidence and excellence. The institution aspires to instill scientific zeal and develop skilled human resource to contemporary challenges. The college has been facilitating young adult learners with opportunities to hone their ethics and leadership potential. To sensitize learners towards inclusive social concerns, human rights, gender and environmental issues is also the mission of the institution.

#### The Context

The college over the long history of four decades has created a niche for itself in the academic, extra-curricular and sports fields. These achievements are surely enough in itself to boast of the name and the fame the college is enjoying. Still the college was facing certain challenges which were of utmost importance. The first challenge the college was facing was of administrative nature. The college had been following the age old pattern of working manually in the office. The IQAC and the Principal of the institution decided to strike back in a powerful manner by introducing the technological world to the administration. The whole of the administrative branch has been computerized. This apart the library too has been computerized. The college in the academic world introduced the technique of remedial classes and preparing question banks keeping in view the examination perspective and entrance of admission. The students belonging to the college are given extra coaching free of cost by addressing their problems. Their skills are sharpened and chiseled keeping in view the patterns of the final examinations. They are given a list of important questions prepared by the expert faculty. This has helped them attain their targets in a better way.

#### The Practice & the Evidence of the Success

The college did away with the age long system of working in the administrative block. The whole system was computerized. The system of the fee collection was very tedious and cumbersome. The college by computerizing the total accounts has successfully got rid of many hurdles. This has resulted in making the system smooth. The college is already facing the dearth of man power. By computerizing the system, the college has successfully overcome the shortage of the staff. Now the work has been facilitated to the extent that the staff has very deftly acquired the new system resulting in the increase in their efficiency. Similarly, the college was not able to bring out the best out of the students. The dropout rate and the failure rate was scaling heights. The college then introduced the UGC sponsored Remedial Classes. The students were given extra coaching, free of cost, in all the subjects in general. The students were given extra guidance in the subjects like English, Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics in particular. The college ensured that the students are provided with the Question Banks framed by the experienced faculty of the college. This action has resulted in a steep downfall in the failure rate. The Question Banks have facilitated the students in such a way that their efforts in the preparation of the final exams have started bearing fruits.

#### **Problems Encountered and Resources Required**

The college had certain problems to face in the process of administration. The account maintenance was very cumbersome to manage. The college had to face long queues of the students who assembled for fee deposit. Now the things have smoothed out. Similarly the students were facing a lot of problem in studies. The college was finding it hard to control the dropout rate and the failure. The remedial classes came as a boon for such students. The students are now finding it easy to combat the problems they were facing. The college required the infrastructure in the shape of computer systems. The Government provided the same from its resources. The staff was trained by the computer experts. The software required was purchased. The resources required for the remedial classes were granted by the UGC.
