

More About College: It was a landmark day in the history of Rajouri when this College was declared open on 6th of June 1981 by Jammu and Kashmir Government. The secular character of the college has proved to be teaching consequence of rich traditions and a beacon of light not only at state level but also at the National level. This college was established as Govt. Degree College Rajouri in 1981 with 73 students having few subjects of arts stream in a limited accommodation in DIET building Jawarharnagar Rajouri. Presently the college is catering knowledge to thousands of students(both Boys and Girls) in science, arts, commerce, BCA and BBA streams at UG level and four subjects M. Sc Chemistry, M.C.A, M.A. Urdu and M.A. Arabic at PG level through an excellent team of 83 faculty members in a beautiful college campus situated at Kheora Rajouri. In addition to it, several skill enhancement and ability enhancement courses have already been started. The affiliation process of M.Sc Physics, M.Sc Geography and M.A English at PG level and Information Technology, Bio-Chemistry, Applied Mathematics at UG level with university of Jammu has been initiated.

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Government P. G. College Rajouri is located at a small beautiful plateau at village Kheora, two and half kilo meters to the north of City of Kings, Rajouri town. College campus gives a picturesque look in the backdrop of snow caped Pir Panjal Mountain ranges of the Middle Himalayas in the far north. A monument of Mian Hathu's times Dhani Dhar Fort lies just to the east. In the west lies the Darhal Tawi a source tributary of Manawar Tawi and historic Rajouri town in the south.. College has gratitude at 33.25°N latitudes and 69.30°E longitude. College has been constructed at a plateau spreading its grandeur of buildings, lawns and grounds over almost 100 kanals of land, which houses four separate hostels for boys and girls and staff quarters apart from administrative block, lecture theatres, well equipped laboratories and a multi-purpose Hall to carryout co-curricular activities. The College has rich library having a collection of over 60000 volumes. The College also has departmental libraries for its PG Departments and several other departments also. Moreover, latest journals, magazines, periodicals etc. are also subscribed. In addition to the University sub-office, the college has three Distance Education Study Centres functioning under the aegis of Indira Gandhi National Open University New Delhi, Directorate of Distance Education, University of Jammu, Jammu and the Mualana Azad National Urdu University, Hyderabad for those students who cannot offer regular admissions. The College is NAAC reaccredited "B" Grade with CGPA2.41 in 2019. The College has constituted an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a post accreditation quality sustenance measures. The Department of Science and Technology (DST) New Delhi has released grants to the tune of Rs. 69 lakh in November 2015 under FIST Programme 2014 for development of Lab. Infrastructure of all Science Departments. The College feels honoured on being recognized as College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) by the UGC New Delhi in April 2016 under the status of CPE. The Department of Botany and Zoology has started skill based vocational courses in Mushroom Cultivation, Apiculture, Sericulture and Green Farming from the Session 2015-16.

Special Features of the college: Higher Education is much essential for an accepted survival and sustained development of nations. Today's objective of Higher Education is not to go for quantitative expansion of literacy but its ultimate aim is quality-based life oriented education and proper management of its acquisition and the absence of the same is an obstacle on the way of Higher Education. To tackle such problems, the concept of lead colleges and cluster Colleges is now very much internationally in focus for research and training oriented education. Academic Session 2022-23 Undergraduate Programmes:

Admission to 4 year undergraduate Programme (FYUP) under New Education Policy (NEP)-2020.

From current session the Govt. is implementing New Education Policy (NEP)-2020. The key highlights of New Education Policy (NEP)-2020 are as under:

National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 aims to revamp all aspects of India's education system that was in place over three decades and bring it closer to the best global standards of education. The cabinet under the guidance of Prime Minister Sh. Narendra Modi has now given a nod to this new education policy for the 21st century. The new education policy is applauded by many authorities and is regarded as a promising model of education reforms that have been brought in India.

NEP 2020: New education policy for higher education

- The four-year bachelor's course is to be preferred in various disciplines. Students who are mid-term dropouts would be given credit for their term they completed and an option to complete their degree after the break.
- Colleges would no longer have an affiliation to the university. The deemed university status will also be ended. Over the next 15 years, the colleges would be given a graded autonomy to provide degrees.
- There is a proposal to cap the fees that are charged by private institutions with respect to higher education.
- Top-rated global universities in the world would be facilitated to come to India, as well as the top Indian institutes would be encouraged to go global.
- There is a proposal for flexible curriculum, creative combos of subjects, integrated vocational education at UG level. Students would also be allowed multiple entries and exit points at the UG level.
- The University grants commission would be replaced by the higher education commission of India.
- After a master's degree, there will be no MPhil degree prior to PhD. Students can directly apply for PhD after their masters.

The policy envisages broad based, multi-disciplinary, holistic Under Graduate education with flexible curricula, creative combinations of subjects, integration of vocational education and multiple entry and exit points with appropriate certification. UG education can be of 3 or 4 years with multiple exit options and appropriate certification within this period. For example, Certificate after 1 year, Advanced Diploma after 2 years, Bachelor's Degree after 3 years and Bachelor's with Research after 4 years.

Flexible UG Courses with Multiple Entries and Exits

As per the NEP, the students will now have options of multiple exits during their UG programme. For example, a student can exit just after 1st year of graduation with a certificate in hand. If he/she opts to exit after the second year, an Advanced Diploma will be awarded for 2 years of successful completion of study. As usual, the 3rd year of UG completion will result in a Bachelor's Degree and 4th year of UG completion will be awarded with a Bachelor's of Research/Honours.

Admission to Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP) in the affiliated Colleges under National Education Policy (NEP-2020)

The following instructions are being issued to all the affiliated colleges for admitting students to the Undergraduate Degree Programme under National Education Policy (NEP 2020) during the academic session 2022-23.

Subject Combinations

- 1. Major Course: Any subject in a discipline in which student wants to graduate for 3 years bachelor degree or 4 years bachelor degree with honours/research (Annexure-I).
- 2. Minor Course: Any subject other than major available in the college within same discipline (Annexure-I).
- 3. Multidisciplinary Course (MD): Any subject of student's choice which is of interdisciplinary nature from faculties other than Major and Minor.
- 4. Ability Enhancement Course (AEC): It may be Modern Indian Language (MIL), English Language (General), Communication Skill, Mathematical Ability.
- 5. Skill Enhancement Course (SEC): Two credits course each from 1st to 3rd semesters. The courses shall be chosen from the basket of courses from NSQF as notified by the University of Jammu. The University Departments/respective Board of Studies can propose new courses in addition to NSQF.
- Value Added Courses (VAC): Four credits comprising of two courses (02) credits each) in 1st and 2nd semester(s) are compulsory courses.

 - (a) Understanding India (b) Environmental Science and Education
 - (c) Digital Technology
- (d) Health and Wellness

In addition to the above, there will be two optional courses of two credits each in 3rd and 4th semester(s) out of the following:

- (a) Community Engagement
- (b) National Cadet Corp (NCC)
- (c) National Service Scheme (NSS) (d) Sports

(e) Cultural

(f) Yoga Education

(These optional courses are to be offered by the college subject to the availability of faculty/infrastructure).

- 7. All the Principals of the degree colleges (Govt. and Private) are requested to ensure that the list of the major, minor, multidisciplinary and other courses alongwith intake capacity shall be made available on their website.
- 8. Students will choose major, minor, multidisciplinary and other courses at the time of their admissions. The admission shall be made according to the merit, subject to the seats available in the respective course.
- 9. The eligibility criteria for admission in various disciplines and fee shall be as per the statutes in vogue.







Summer Internship 7.

Each student is required to undergo 2 credits of internship in 5th semester. The details of the Summer Internship shall be notified separately.

Research Project/Dissertation

Students pursuing Under Graduate Degree with research shall be required to undergo a Research Project/Dissertation of 12 credits in 8th semester.

Credit Summary:

- 1 Year Certificate = minimum 40 credits
- 2 Year Diploma = minimum 80 credits
- 3 Year Degree = 120 credits
- 4 Year Degree = 160 credits
- Note: Student/s can swap between Minor and Major at the start of 3rd Semester only if vacancy/s available after following procedure laid down for the purpose. The college shall notify the vacancy/s which are to be filled in order of merit out of the applicants.

INFRASTRUCTURE, LEARNING RESOURCES AND FACILITIES, NCC, NSS, Library, Women Development Cell, Hostels

FACILITIES AVAILABLE FOR CURRICULAR, CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTRA-CURRIICULAR ACTIVITIES:

I) CLASSROOMS:

Our college has 20 spacious class rooms (out of which 14 are smart rooms) with proper light arrangement and ventilation, Dias and Podium, seating arrangement with proper visibility for both students and teachers and attractive white and green boards.

LABORATORIES:

The College has nineteen well equipped laboratories, four in Chemistry Department, three in Geography Department two each in Physics, Zoology and Botany Departments and one each in Biotechnology and Geology Departments, for the conduct of science practicals which facilitate students to conduct regular practicals during the session and in annual examinations. College has one Language Digital Lab also.

Similarly, the college has five technology enabled laboratories (two in computer department and one each in Departments of Physics, Chemistry and Geography for conducting computer based practicals.

II) CENTRAL LIBRARY:

The Central Library of College has a collection of about 60,000 books, comprising of reference, text and general books. Reading room and book bank facility is available for the benefit of students and staffs. A research division is established in the library for researcher and budding scholars of the College. The College has subscribed several magazines, newspapers and journals which remain available in the library reading room. The College Library is fully atomized which is linked with the College website www.gpgcollegerajouri.ac.in.

III) DEPARTMENTAL LIBRARY

College has two departmental libraries one in the P.G. Department of Chemistry and the other in P.G. Department of Computer Sciences to facilitate the needs of M. Sc Chemistry and MCA students respectively. Several other departments are also developing Departmental Libraries.

LIBRARY RULES:

The Library observes the same working hours and holidays as the College has. However, it remains open for the students during the summer vacations from 8:30 AM to 7:30PM.

- 2. Every student at the time of borrowing books from the Library shall produce his/her Identity Card. A person borrowing boo:ks from the Library shall be held responsible for any loss of pages or damage of the book and he/she will have to pay fine in addition to double the cost of that book.
- 3. Teachers are not allowed to take more than ten books at a time. No member of the

- College staff may borrow books from the Library on his own name for the use of the students.
- 4. Members of the College staff or the establishment at the time of leaving the College or transfer, retirement or otherwise shall return all the books borrowed by them before the LPC or "No Demand" certificate is issued in his/her favour.
- 5. Students can borrow only one book at a time, which include at least one book of the subject taken by him/her.
- 6. Students must return books taken by them within fifteen days. Any student retaining a book after the time allowed shall have to pay a fine of Rs. 1/- per day until the same is returned, provided the fine incurred shallnot exceed double the cost of the book.
- 7. The Librarian shall keep a record of the book issued. In the beginning of every month or at the time of realization of dues to the cashier, librarian shall submit to the office a list of fine imposed on students for latereturn of books. Those students shall have to deposit the fine with the College cashier within seven days of the submission of the list, failing which the student will not be allowed to attend the classes.
- 8. Books required by teachers of the College, if borrowed by any other person, must be returned on the receipt of a notice issued from the librarian.
- 9. The same person shall not be allowed to barrow any book for the second time within two days from date of its return by him/her. This rule, however, does not apply to Teachers of the College.
- 10. Any person, who either loses a book or otherwise damages it, shall be liable to pay an amount not less than double the cost of the book. When it belongs to a set or series, and unless he can replace it, he shall be liable to pay the cost of the whole set or series.
- 11. Students free from lecture work may visit the Library during the college hours. No talking or disturbance of any kind is allowed in the library. Any infringement of rules shall incur punishment/fine.
- 12. Library is meant only for the use of those persons who are directly or indirectly connected with the academic life of the College.
- 13. Books of the following description shall not be issued by the library.
 - a. Reference Books
 - b. Periodicals/Magazines
 - c. Dictionaries of prominence.
 - d. Encyclopedia/Census Reports
 - e. Rare books identified by College Library Committee/Principal.
- 14. Periodicals shall not be issued except for consultation in the library premises.
- 15. All books shall have to be returned to the library every year at the time of stock checking especially in April- May. The librarian shall make a report of books found damaged/missing to the principal, soon after the stockchecking is over and shall prepare the list of books to be written off.
- 16. Teachers of the College, who wish to retain certain books during the summer vacation, shall have to return the same to the library at the time of stock checking.
- 17. Sleeping, smoking, chatting, eating, mobile phones and discussion etc. are strictly prohibited in the library.

BOTANICAL GARDEN:

Our college has a well maintained botanical garden where the students study various plants and other aspects of botanical life which facilitates them in enriching their knowledge.

IV) SEMINAR HALLS:

V) The college has two seminar halls (one each in Department of Computer Sciences and Chemistry). These halls are regularly used for conducting class seminars. The students of post graduate departments are regularly promoted for active involvement in paper presentations, group discussions & class seminars etc.

VI) SPECIALIZED FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT FOR TEACHING, LEARNING AND RESEARCH:

The college has five computer labs with 94 computers. The staff is given a free access to internet so that they can enrich their knowledge and then in turn the students can be benefitted from their experiences and knowledge.

The computerized library also helps the staff and the students to understand the value of research and knowledge.

College has UGC network resource centre with twelve computers where students and staff access theinternet.

VII) SPORTS:

College has sports block located behind Computer Sciences Department.

OUTDOOR AND INDOOR GAMES:

The college has following facilities for outdoor games:

- A Lush–green open space ground for playing cricket.
- Well maintained courts for playing kabaddi, volleyball, football, Hockey, Handball, badminton and kho-kho.

The college also has facilities for playing following indoor games:

- * Table Tennis. * Chess
- * Boxing * Caramboard
- Wrestling * Power lifting
- * Judo

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Games are played regularly and every student is expected to participate in them.
- 2. Every student is expected to have the usual equipments for the games he/she opts for.
- 3. After the completion of the admission process, college teams are announced on the basis of the trials and arigorous selection process.
- 4. The players in their own interest are advised to be punctual and regular in their class work. Inter-grouptournaments in all the games are conducted periodically.
- 5. Cups and prizes are given to the winning groups.
- 6. Extraordinary players are considered for the awards every year decided by the competent authority on the basis of the overall performance of the players' in different

games.

- 7. Members of the various teams must report punctually for practice and for matches.
- 8. Any player, who indulges in any act of indiscipline in the College, shall not be eligible for any prize, certificate or College colours or participation in games.

9. All the games shall be played after 1:00 PM only.

VIII) **GYMNASIUM:**

Our college has well equipped Gymnasium with all the modern equipments for the maintenance of personal health and hygiene.

IX) AUDITORIUM:

The college is having a multipurpose hall for organising all type of programmes & special seminars. The seating capacity of the hall is around 300 students

X) NSS:

The College has two units of NSS, each consisting of 100 volunteers. Each unit functions under a programme officer. The students have to apply on a prescribed form for seeking admission to each unit at the beginning of the session. Students enr olled as NSS volunteers are required to put in at least 120 hours of social work and attend one camp of 10 days duration in one session to become eligible to receive a certificate. The special camp at University level and a National Integration camp are also arranged every year, generally during summer/winter vocation.

XI) NCC:

To stimulate interest in the defence of the Nation and to build up a reservoir of man power for the ArmedForces. The College has two units of NCC, consisting of 100 Male Cadet and 60 Female Cadet.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Every enrolled NCC cadet has to undergo two parades of two hours each week and is required to attend45 parades in a year.
- 2. All cadets require 75% attendance in parades for eligibility.
- 3. Enrolled cadets have also to attend camps.
- 4. The uniforms are issued by the College and to be returned at the end of the academic session to the officers' incharge, failing which the permission will not be accorded to appear in the University Examinations.
- 5. 'B' and 'C' certificate examinations held annually for cadets in 2nd and 3rd year of NCC training respectively.
- 6. Misbehaviour and misconduct in NCC activities can debar the cadet from appearing in the University Examinations.

XII) YOGA:

The College has established a Yoga Centre in Physical Education Block, equipped with all necessary facilities and study material.

YOGA ACHIEVEMENTS

Yoga has tremendous value not only for physical health but also for a mental and spiritual development. Yoga is a complete system introduced by Indian experts as an acceptable life style for the entire humanity at large. India undoubtedly possesses an unmatched heritage represented by Yoga for both preventive and creative health care. Therefore there is increased global interest in yoga for apply its effectiveness as a part of holistic health approach to a complete rejuvenation of body mind and spirit. Today Yoga has been recognized across the globe because of its great potentialities in promoting, maintaining and transforming life as a whole approaching higher stages of evolution of mental spiritual and physical health Yoga is introduced in different Universities and other institutions and is taught as a subject of Philosophy and sports coaching across the globe.

WOMEN DEVELOPMENT CELL/WOMEN STUDY CENTRE: Centre for women's development is functional in this college under the aegis of UGC from 2004 with an objective to conduct training programmes, seminars and workshops in collaboration with different agencies and institutions associated directly or indirectly with formulation, execution and implementation of various policies and programmes for gender improvement and development. In addition to this the centre arranges advocacy and legal awareness extension and field outreach camps/activities.

XIII) UGC – NETWORK RESOURCE CENTRE

College has set up UGC-NRC for students and teachers of the College. In the Centre students/teacher can accessinternet.

Moreover, College has subscribed N-List programme of Inflibnet Centre through which more than 50000 Books and Journals are accessible.

EDUSAT:

The College has Edu-Sat facility through which students attend online classes delivered by expert teachers in the Edu-Sat hub.

XIV) FIRST AID CELL:

The college runs a first aid cell to facilitate immediate medical assistance to students and staff. A doctor is deputed weekly from district hospital Rajouri to visit the first aid centre of the college for free medical checkup of the students.

XV) ECO-CLUB

Govt. P. G. College Rajouri has established an Eco-Club for the development of Eco-Friendly Environment in the state in general and Rajouri District in particular. Club organizes the functions like Environment awareness, wild life protection, WWF functioning and other related pollution free/Polythene free life style.

XVI) COLLEGE CANTEEN

COLLEGE HAS A SUBSIDIZED CANTEEN which provides snacks and light refreshment to the students at subsidized rates. The college has a canteen committee which keeps an eye on the working of the canteen. As and when any change or reform is required, the committee immediately comes into action.

XVII) COLLEGE HOSTELS

Hostel facility is available for 100 male students in General Boys Hostel and SC Boys Hostel and 50 female students in SC Hostel for girls. Recently a New Hostel constructed under MPDP is handed over to the College. The Hostel can accommodate more than 100 female students. Students desirous of seeking admission to the Hostels must apply on the proper Application Form which can be had from the Hostel Wardens free of cost. Hostels are equipped with internet (wifi) facilities, newspaper and well furnished infrastructure.

HOSTEL RULES

- 1. Boarders will be required to sign the receipts for the items of furniture and other things issued to them. They will be responsible for any damage to doors, windows, glass panes, furniture, almirahsand fittings and other hostel property.
- 2. Meals are served in the 'Dining Hall' only. No one is allowed to cook meals in his/her room.
- 3. The Hostel Mess is run by the contractor/ on co-operative basis, managed by the Mess Committee, comprising Boarders and respective Wardens.
- 4. Mess charges must be cleared by the 10th of every month.
- 5. The boys hostels gates are opened at 5:00 AM in summer and 6:00 AM in the winter and are closed at 10:00 PM in summer and 8:00 PM in the winter. Gates can be opened during the night only in case of an emergency. No boarder shall be allowed to move out after the attendance is taken at night.
- 6. The girls' hostel gates are opened at 6:00 AM in summer and 8:00 AM in the winter and are close at 7:30 PM in summer and 6:00 PM in the winter. No girl will leave the hostel premises without the written permission of the Warden.
- 7. The hostlers are responsible for the safety of their belongings. Those breaking the rules are liable to be fined and such articles left on the premises may be confiscated during vacation.

- 8. The hostel authorities shall not be responsible for the loss or theft of any cash or valuables kept in the rooms of the boarders.
- 9. No boarder is allowed to any amusement which is likely to disturb other boarders.
- 10. Ragging in the hostels is strictly prohibited. Any student of the hostel indulging in ragging is liable to be expelled from the hostel as well as from the College.
- 11. Any refundable dues shall be released only after all due payments have been made by a boarder. The claim for all such refunds should be made within six months from the date of leaving the hostel.
- 12. The College authorities reserve the right to modify any of the existing rules without prior notice. Decision of the Principal in all matters shall be final and binding.

Note: The Principal has the authority to amend/add/delete any of the rules given in this information Brochure without any notice or specifying any reason, thereof.

XXXI) CAREER COUNSELLING CELL

The College has established an active Guidance and Counseling Cell with aims to journey with students in their lives by helping them in securing employment, selection of courses, study habit and overall offer insight, guidance and support to help students to understand and manage different career and life style issues. There is a proposal to start coaching classes for entrance tests of professional courses and other competitive exams conducted by PSC and UPSC.

XXXII) STUDENT GRIEVANCES CELL

A grievances cell has been established in the College CAMPUS. The student approach to the cell to voice their grievances or may send his/her grievance to the principal over mail gdcrajouri@gmail.com or put the note in the Grievances Box, located near the principal office. The cell redresses the grievances by sorting out the problems promptly and judiciously.

Hence all the students are impressed upon to bring their issues/problems/grievances to the notice of the Student Grievance Cell. The grievances cell should pertain to the jurisdiction of our college preferably.

XXXIII) PLACEMENT UNIT

College has UDAAN Cell, under the Special Industry Initiative of the Prime Minister, the National Skills Development Corporation (NSDC) and Ministry of Home Affairs have been mandated to work with the corporate sector in bringing about a positive change in the employment and skills space of Jammu and Kashmir. The Special Industry Initiative, known as "UDAAN", targets the youths of J&K, specifically graduates and postgraduates, who are seeking global and local opportunities. UDAAN thereby aims to provide skills to 40 000 youth over a period of 5 years in high growth sectors. UDAAN has two objectives:

- To provide exposure to the graduates and post graduates of Jammu and Kashmir to the best of corporate India and
- To provide corporate India with exposure to the rich talent pool available in the state

The college has a Debating Society and Cultural/Literary Club to plan, organize and regulate student welfare programmes and activities including cultural and literary programmes, festivals, camps, extension lectures, youth club and societies etc.

XXXVII) Wall MAGAZINE & Newsletter are also available in the college where students creativity is displayed.

XXXVIII) TOURS AND PICNICS

Annual Educational Tour, Subject Tours, Hiking and Trekking expeditions are also organized from time totime.

XXXIX) PRIZES, MEDALS AND CERTIFICATES OF MERIT:

Students with outstanding performance in the curricular and extra-curricular activities of the college areawarded prizes / medals / certificates of merit.

SCHOLARSHIP AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Number of scholarships and financial assistance as detailed below are given by various agencies tostudents of the following categories.

- Scholarships for SC/ST/RBA/OBC/Pahari students
- 2. Scholarships for Physically Handicapped
- 4. Minority scholarships

In addition to the above-mentioned scholarships, Financial Assistance is given to the deserving poor students by the college out of the Students' Aid Fund. However, the criteria for the financial assistance to the deserving students are decided by the concerned committee appointed for the purpose on the basis of guidelines issued by the Government.

Students are required to apply for various Scholarships or Financial Assistance on the prescribed application form. The scholarship and financial assistance are, however, awarded to deserving students subject to the following conditions:

- (a) A good conduct
- (b) Satisfactory progress report in the studies
- (c) Regularity in attendance
- (d) A report of the tutor in-charge
- (e) Income/Category certificates issued by the competent authority.

Guardians of the students applying for any scholarship must give an undertaking that in case his/her ward participates in strikes or any other subversive activities, he/she will refund the amount of the scholarship received by his/her ward in one installment.

In no case a student will get more than one scholarship in a year.

(c) CERTIFICATES TO BE SUBMITTED:

A student seeking admission should present himself/herself personally along with the parent/guardian to the college and shall present the following documents.

IN CASE OF REGULAR CANDIDATES:

- 1. Marks certificates in original of the qualifying examination (along with four attested copies).
- 2. Provisional/character certificates in original from the Head of the Institution last attended.
- 3. Date of Birth Certificate Secondary School certificate issued by J&K State Board of School Education.
- 4. Three copies of the passport size photographs.
- 5. Category certificate, income certificate from the Competent Authority (only for those who want toapply for scholarship/financial assistance).
- 6. The undertaking in the form of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs. 10/-dully attested by Notary as mentioned in Annexure-I.

IN CASE OF PRIVATE CANDIDATES:

The candidates who have passed their qualifying examination as a private candidate shall have to submitthe following documents in addition to the above:

- 1. An undertaking in the form of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs. 10/-dully attested byNotary as mentioned in Annexure-II.
- 2. Provisional certificate from J&K State Board of School Education and a character certificate from a first class magistrate / Dy SP (Police) of that area in the case of private candidates.

However, the students who have passed their qualifying examination from an institution other than the J&K State Board of School Education shall have to submit the following documents in addition to the above:

- 1. Migration Certificate in original from the University/Board from which the student has passed the qualifying examination.
- 2. Eligibility Certificate from the University of Jammu.
- 3. The undertaking in the form of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs. 10/-dully attested by Notary as mentioned in Annexure-III.

A student is permitted to take the university examination subject to the fulfilment of the following eligibility requirements.

- (a) The student pays the university examination fee at the time of submission of the examination form.
- (b) A student cannot sit in the university examination unless he/she has attended 75% of the total lectures delivered during the session in each theory subject and a minimum of 30 practical sessions in each science subject involving practical.

COLLEGE RULES

GENERAL RULES

- Ragging in any form, on or off the College Campus, including the Hostel is a cognizable offence and the students involved in ragging will be severely punished, even to the extent of being expelled from the College.
- 2. Use of all sorts of drug/smoking is strictly prohibited.
- 3. No outsider is allowed to enter the college without a valid reason.
- **4.** If a student remains absent from the College without permission for more than twenty days, his/her nameshall be struck off from the College rolls.
- 5. Unlawful assembly of students in the college is banned.
- **6.** Writing of graffiti on the walls or sticking of posters is a cognizable offence.
- **7.** A student desirous of withdrawing his/her name from the college rolls should submit an application, countersigned by the parent/guardian of the student. The withdrawal certificate shall be issued only after the student clears all College dues. Such students shall in no case be readmitted during the same academic session.
- **8.** Any student, who indulges in any indiscipline in the College, shall not be eligible for any prize, certificate, College Colour awards or scholarship from the Institution. This shall apply to all the students including NCC cadets, NSS volunteers, players or the hostellers.
- 9. Use and possession of mobile by the students is totally banned on the College campus.
- **10.** The College Authorities reserve the right to change, modify or suspend the rules as and when required.
- **11.** Not more than 15 duties in all shall be given to a student who has participated in Sports/NSS or any other extra-curricular activities of the college during a semester.
- 12. ANY STUDENT FOUND INDULGING IN ANY UNDESIRABLE ACTIVITY IN THE COLLEGE SHALL BE DEALT WITH UNDERRULES EVEN TO THE EXTENT OF RUSTICATION FROM THE COLLEGE.

IDENTITY CARDS

- 1. Every student on being admitted shall be issued an Identity Card which he/she will carry on at all times and shall produce on demand by any member of the college staff anywhere within the College premises.
- 2. The loss of the Identity Card should be reported immediately.
- 3. A new identity card shall not ordinarily be issued. However, after proper verification a duplicate card may be issued on payment of Rs. 100/- accompanied by an undertaking/affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs. 5/- dully attested by a Magistrate/Notary.
- 4. Identity Card must be returned at the end of each session failing which an amount of Rs. 200/- shall be charged, along with the requisite undertaking/affidavit.
