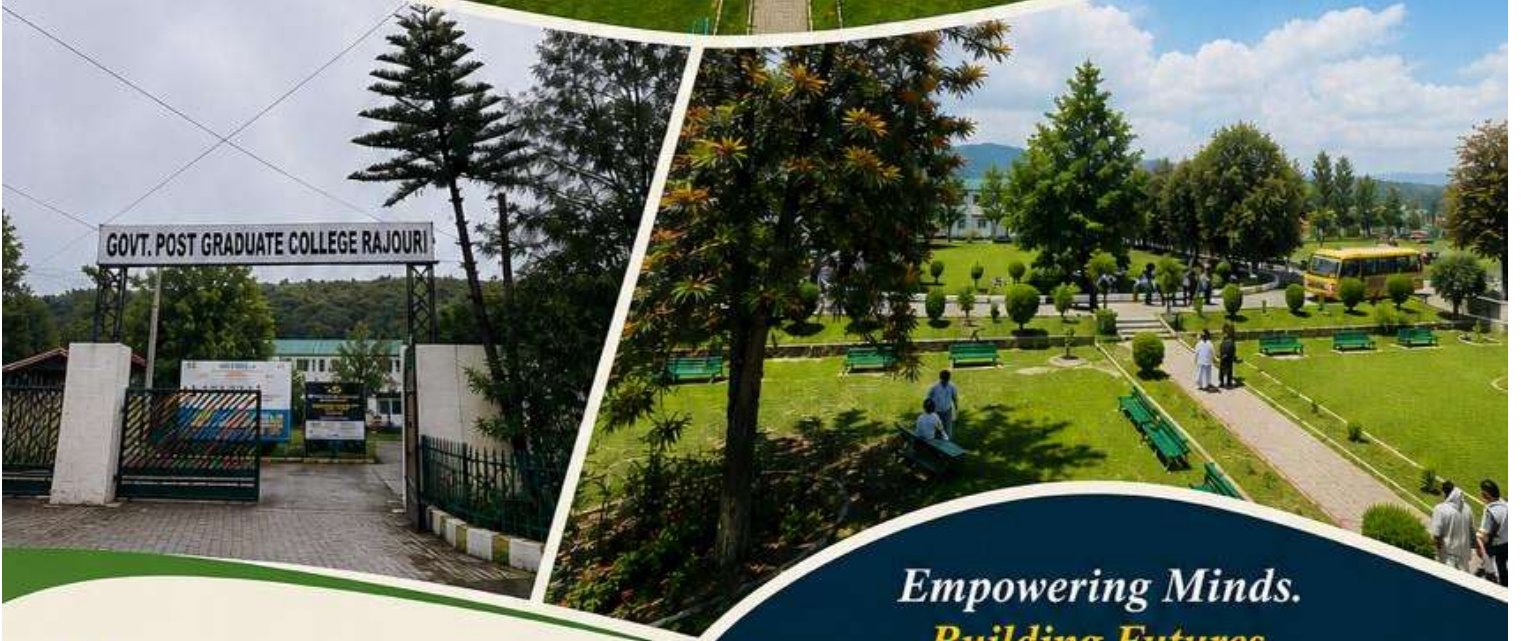
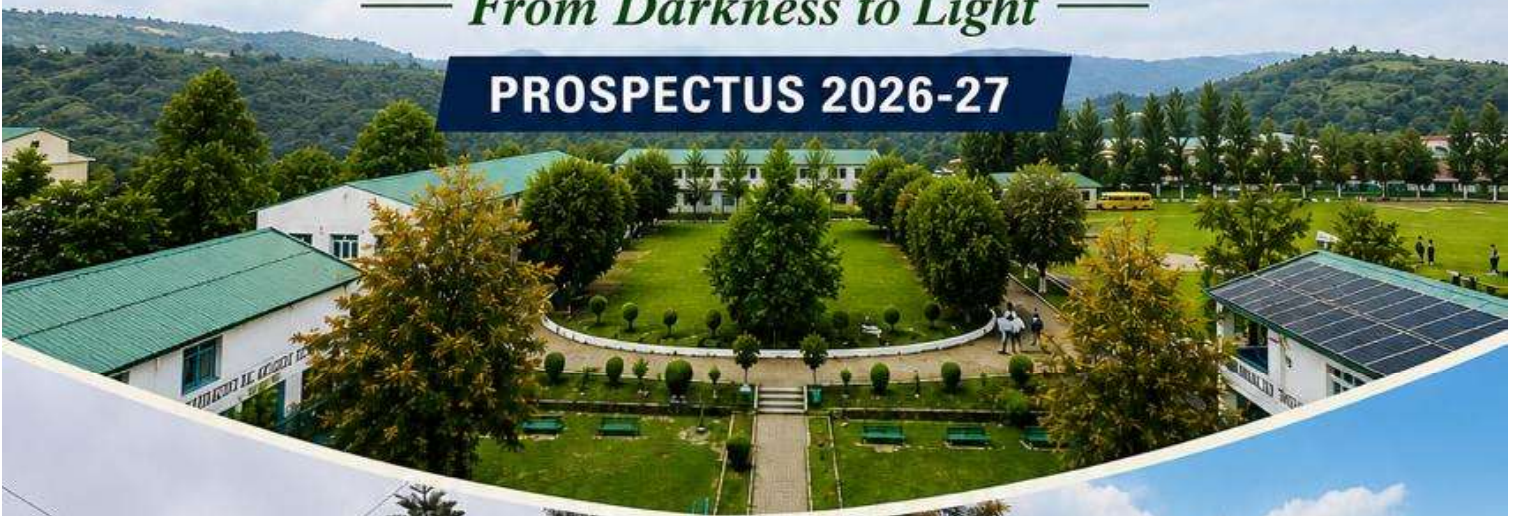

About the College

It was a landmark day in the history of Rajouri when this College was declared open on 6th of June 1981 by Jammu and Kashmir Government. The secular character of the college has proved to be teaching consequence of rich traditions and a beacon of light not only at state level but also at the National level. This college was established as Govt. Degree College Rajouri in 1981 with 73 students having few subjects of arts stream in a limited accommodation in DIET building Jawarharnagar Rajouri. Presently the college is catering knowledge to thousands of students (both Boys and Girls) in science, arts, commerce, BCA and BBA streams at UG level and four subjects M. Sc Chemistry, M.C.A, M.A. Urdu and M.A. Arabic at PG level through an excellent team of 83 faculty members in a beautiful college campus situated at Kheora Rajouri. In addition to it, several skill enhancement and ability enhancement courses have already been started. The affiliation process of M.Sc. Physics, M.Sc. Geography and M.A English at PG level and Information Technology, Bio-Chemistry, Applied Mathematics at UG level with university of Jammu has been initiated.

Government P. G. College Rajouri is located at a small beautiful plateau at village Kheora, two and half kilo meters to the north of City of Kings, Rajouri town. College campus gives a picturesque look in the backdrop of snow capped Pir Panjal Mountain ranges of the Middle Himalayas in the far north. A monument of Mian Hathu's times Dhani Dhar Fort lies just to the east. In the west lies the Darhal Tawi a source tributary of Manawar Tawi and historic Rajouri town in the south. College has gratitude at 33.25°N latitudes and 69.30°E longitude. College has been constructed at a plateau spreading its grandeur of buildings, lawns and grounds over almost 100 Kanals of land, which houses four separate hostels for boys and girls and staff quarters apart from administrative block, lecture theatres, well equipped laboratories and a multi-purpose Hall to carryout co-curricular activities. The College has rich library having a collection of over 60000 volumes. The College also has departmental libraries for its PG Departments and several other departments also. Moreover, latest journals, magazines, periodicals etc. are also subscribed. In addition to the University sub-office, the college has three Distance Education Study Centers functioning under the aegis of Indira Gandhi National Open University New Delhi, Directorate of Distance Education, University of Jammu, Jammu and the Maulana Azad National Urdu University, Hyderabad for those students who cannot offer regular admissions. The College is NAAC reaccredited "B" Grade with CGPA2.41 in 2019. The College has constituted an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a post accreditation quality sustenance measures. The Department of Science and Technology (DST) New Delhi has released grants to the tune of Rs. 69 lakhs in November 2015 under FIST Programme 2014 for development of Lab. Infrastructure of all Science Departments. The College feels honoured on being recognized as College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) by the UGC New Delhi in April 2016 under the status of CPE. The Department of Botany and Zoology has started skill based vocational courses in Mushroom Cultivation, Apiculture, Sericulture and Green Farming from the Session 2015-16.

Special Features of the College

Higher Education is much essential for an accepted survival and sustained development of nations. Today's objective of Higher Education is not to go for quantitative expansion of literacy but its ultimate aim is quality-based life-oriented education and proper management of its acquisition and the absence of the same is an obstacle on the way of Higher Education. To tackle such problems, the concept of lead colleges and cluster Colleges is now very much internationally in focus for research and training-oriented education. Admission to 4-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP) under New Education Policy (NEP)-2020

The National Education Policy 2020 aims to address the many growing developmental imperatives of our country. It proposes the revision and revamping of all aspects of the education structure, including its regulation and governance, to create a new system that is aligned with the aspirational goals of 21st century education, including SDG4, while building upon India's traditions and value systems. It lays particular emphasis on the development of the creative potential of each individual. It is based on the principle that education must develop not only cognitive capacities - both the 'foundational capacities' of literacy and numeracy and 'higher-order' cognitive capacities, such as critical thinking and problem solving – but also social, ethical, and emotional capacities and dispositions.

Key Highlights of the Policy

1. Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in higher education to be raised to 50% by 2035
2. Around 3.5 crore seats to be added in higher education
3. Undergraduate education can be of 3 or 4 years with multiple exit options and appropriate certification at different stages
4. Academic Bank of Credits to be established to facilitate Transfer of Credits for lateral admission to other institutes
5. Multidisciplinary Education and Research Universities (MERUs), at par with IITs and IIMs, to be set up as models of best multidisciplinary education of global standards in the country
6. The **National Research Foundation** will be created as an apex body for fostering a strong research culture and building research capacity across higher education
7. **Higher Education Commission of India** (HECI) will be set up as a single overarching umbrella body for the entire higher education system, excluding medical and legal education. Public and private higher education institutions will be governed by the same set of norms for regulation, accreditation and academic standards.
8. Affiliation of colleges is to be phased out in 15 years and a stage-wise mechanism is to be established for granting graded autonomy to colleges


Flexible UG Courses with Multiple Entries and Exits

As per the NEP, the students will now have options of multiple exits during their UG programme. For example, a student can exit just after 1st year of graduation with a certificate in hand. If he/she opts to exit after the second year, an Advanced Diploma will be awarded for 2 years of successful completion of study. As usual, the 3rd year of UG completion will result in a Bachelor's Degree and 4th year of UG completion will be awarded with a Bachelor's of Research/ Honours.

The credits earned at various levels will get credited into a digitalized Academic Bank of Credit (ABC). Students can use their earned credits to take admission in another institution to further continue their studies for the remaining year/s of their graduation courses.

 - (a) Understanding India
 - (b) Environmental Science and Education
 - (c) Digital Technology
 - (d) Health and WellnessIn addition to the above, there will be two optional courses of two credits each in 3rd and 4th semester(s) out of the following:
 - (a) Community Engagement
 - (b) National Cadet Corp (NCC)
 - (c) National Service Scheme (NSS)
 - (d) Sports
 - (e) Cultural
 - (f) Yoga Education(These optional courses are to be offered by the college subject to the availability of faculty/infrastructure).
7. All the Principals of the degree colleges (Govt. and Private) are requested to ensure that the list of the major, minor, multidisciplinary and other courses alongwith intake capacity shall be made available on their website.
8. Students will choose major, minor, multidisciplinary and other courses at the time of their admissions. The admission shall be made according to the merit, subject to the seats available in the respective course.

Eligibility for Admission to Four Year Undergraduate Programme Under NEP-2020

Students who have passed the Higher Secondary Part-II examination (10+2 Pattern) of the Jammu and Kashmir State Board of School Education (JKBOSE), Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) or any other examination as recognized and equivalent thereto in all subjects, is eligible for the admission to FYUG Programme.

Payment of Admission Fee

Each student seeking admission to the undergraduate Semester-1st shall be required to submit the prescribed application form along with requisite fee:

- i. For the first and second semester courses at the time of seeking admission to first semester;
- ii. For the third and fourth semester courses at the time of seeking admission to the third semester;
- iii. For the fifth and sixth semester courses at the time of seeking admission to the fifth semester, provided the student continues his/her studies without interruption from first semester to second semester, from third semester to fourth semester and from fifth to sixth semester. If there is a gap of one or more semesters he/she will have to fill up the prescribed application form and pay the fee at the time of seeking admission.

Besides various FYUG Programmes, the college also offers following postgraduate courses:

1. Master of Science in Chemistry (M.Sc. Chemistry)

The College is running postgraduate course (M. Sc.) Chemistry since 2004-05. The total intake capacity is 25 including 05 self-finance seats. The admission is made through JUET by the University of Jammu.

2. Master of Computer Applications (MCA)

The college also offers Master of Computer Applications. The intake capacity for the programme is 19 students. The admission to the course is made through JUET by the University of Jammu.

3. Master of Arts in Urdu (M.A. Urdu)

With an intake capacity of 30 students, the college offers postgraduate course in Urdu, admission for which is made through JUET by the University of Jammu.

4. **Master of Arts in Arabic (M.A. Arabic)**

Since, 2021-22, the College is also offering postgraduate course in Arabic. The intake capacity for the course is 30. The admission is made through JUET by the University of Jammu.

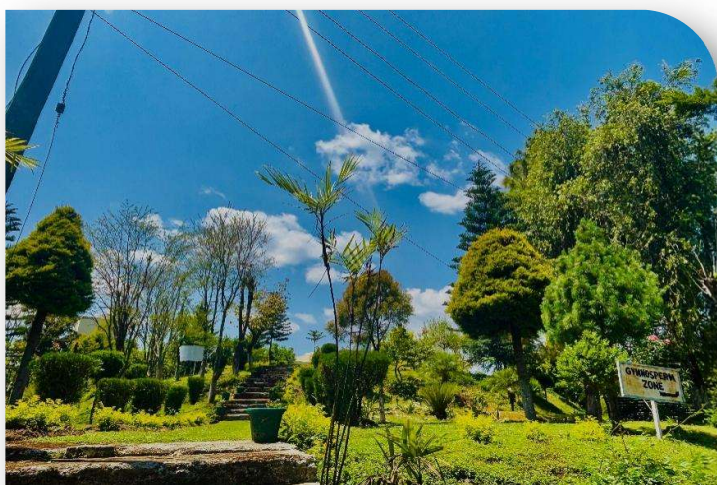

National Service Scheme (NSS)

The college has two units of the National Service Scheme (NSS), each comprising 100 volunteers, functioning under the supervision of a Programme Officer. Students seeking enrolment in NSS are required to apply through a prescribed form at the beginning of the academic session. NSS volunteers are expected to contribute at least 120 hours of social service and participate in a special camp of 10 days' duration within a session to qualify for the NSS certificate. In addition, opportunities are provided to participate in special camps at the university level as well as National Integration Camps, which are generally organised during summer and winter vacations. Through these activities, students develop a sense of social responsibility, community engagement, and national integration.

Career Counselling Cell

This initiative is intended to further strengthen students' preparedness and enhance their prospects for future success.

Students Grievances Cell

A Students' Grievance Cell has been established on the college campus to address the concerns and complaints of students in a fair and timely manner. Students can approach the cell directly to voice their grievances, send their concerns via email to gdcrajouri@gmail.com, or submit a written note in the Grievance Box located near the principal's office. The cell is committed to resolving issues promptly and judiciously, ensuring transparency and fairness in the redressal process. Students are encouraged to bring forward their problems and concerns to the notice of the Grievance Cell so that appropriate action can be taken. However, grievances should preferably fall within the jurisdiction of the college.

Placement Cell

The college has established a UDAAN Cell under the Special Industry Initiative of the Prime Minister. This initiative is implemented by the National Skills Development Corporation (NSDC) in collaboration with the Ministry of Home Affairs, with the objective of bringing positive change in the employment and skill development landscape of Jammu and Kashmir. The UDAAN programme specifically targets the youth of J&K, particularly graduates and postgraduates, who are seeking both local and global employment opportunities. It aims to provide skill development training to 40,000 youth over a period of five years in high-growth sectors, thereby enhancing their employability. The programme has two primary objectives: to provide exposure to the graduates and postgraduates of Jammu and Kashmir to the best of corporate India, and to connect corporate India with the rich and talented youth of the region. Through the UDAAN Cell, the college plays a vital role in bridging the gap between academia and industry, helping students build successful careers.

Picnic and Tours

The college regularly organizes Annual Educational Tours, subject-specific tours, as well as hiking and trekking expeditions to enrich the learning experience of students beyond the classroom. These activities provide practical exposure, helping students gain first-hand knowledge related to their subjects and develop a deeper understanding of real-world applications.

Cultural and Literary Clubs

The college has active Cultural and Literary Clubs that play a vital role in nurturing the creative and intellectual talents of students. These clubs regularly organize a variety of activities such as debates, declamations, poetry recitations, essay writing competitions, quizzes, and cultural programmes. College Magazine and News Letter

The college publishes its annual magazine, *Chiragh-e-Rah*, along with a regular newsletter, providing a vibrant platform for students and faculty to express their creative and intellectual pursuits. These publications feature articles, poems, essays, research insights, and reports on academic and co-curricular activities.

Prizes, Medals and Certificates of Merit

Students who demonstrate outstanding performance in curricular as well as co-curricular activities are duly recognized and rewarded by the college. Prizes, medals, and certificates of merit are awarded to acknowledge their achievements and encourage excellence. This system of recognition not only motivates students to strive for higher standards in academics, sports, and cultural activities but also fosters a spirit of healthy competition and all-round development within the institution.

Scholarships and Financial Aid

A number of scholarships and financial assistance schemes are available to support students from diverse backgrounds. Various agencies provide scholarships to eligible students belonging to categories such as SC/ST/RBA/OBC/Pahari, physically challenged students, and minority communities, thereby promoting inclusive access to education. In addition to these schemes, the college extends financial assistance to deserving and economically weaker students through the Students' Aid Fund. The selection of beneficiaries is carried out by a duly constituted committee in accordance with the guidelines issued by the Government. This support system ensures that financial constraints do not hinder the academic progress of deserving students.

College Rules and Regulations

General Rules

1. Ragging in any form, whether on or off the college campus, including hostels, is a cognizable offence. Students found involved will face strict disciplinary action, which may extend to expulsion from the college.
2. The use of drugs, smoking, and any other intoxicants is strictly prohibited on the college campus.
3. No outsider is permitted to enter the college premises without a valid reason and prior authorization.
4. A student remaining absent from the college without permission for more than twenty days shall have his/her name struck off the college rolls.
5. Unlawful assembly of students within the college premises is strictly prohibited.
6. Writing graffiti on walls or pasting posters without permission is a punishable offence.
7. A student wishing to withdraw from the college must submit an application duly countersigned by the parent/guardian. A withdrawal certificate will be issued only after clearance of all college dues. Such students shall not be readmitted during the same academic session.
8. Any student found indulging in acts of indiscipline shall not be eligible for prizes, certificates, college colour awards, or scholarships. This rule applies to all students, including NCC cadets, NSS volunteers, sportspersons, and hostellers.
9. The use and possession of mobile phones by students on the college campus is strictly prohibited.
10. The college authorities reserve the right to amend, modify, or suspend any rule as and when required.
11. A student participating in sports, NSS, or other co-curricular activities shall not be assigned more than 15 duties during a semester.
12. Any student found involved in undesirable activities shall be dealt with strictly as per college rules, which may include rustication from the institution.
13. **Student Uniform: Uniform may be changed from the current Academic Session. Candidates are advised to contact the College Uniform Committee headed by Dr. Asif Ajaz Lone (Assistant Professor Physics).** Wearing the prescribed uniform is compulsory for all students on all working days.
14. Every student on being admitted shall be issued an Identity Card which he/she will carry on at all times and shall produce on demand by any member of the college staff anywhere within the College premises.
15. Identity Card must be returned at the end of each session failing which an amount of Rs. 200/- shall be charged, along with the requisite undertaking/affidavit.
16. If a student, after admission, remains continuously absent for a period of twenty days without valid or genuine reasons, his/her name shall be struck off from the college rolls and he/she shall not be readmitted during the same academic session or thereafter.

Library Rules and Regulations

1. The library follows the same working hours and holidays as the college. However, it remains open during summer vacations from 8:30 AM to 7:30 PM for students.
2. Students must produce their Identity Card while borrowing books. The borrower is responsible for any loss or damage and shall be required to pay a fine along with double the cost of the book.
3. Teachers are not permitted to borrow more than ten books at a time. No staff member may borrow books in their name for use by students.
4. Members of the college staff must return all borrowed books before leaving the institution due to transfer, retirement, or otherwise, in order to obtain a "No Demand" certificate.
5. Students are allowed to borrow only one book at a time, preferably related to their subject of study.
6. Books must be returned within fifteen days. A fine of ₹1 per day will be charged for late returns, subject to

a maximum of double the cost of the book.

7. The Librarian shall maintain records of issued books and fines. Students must deposit any imposed fine with the college cashier within seven days, failing which they may be debarred from attending classes.
8. Books required by teachers must be returned promptly upon receiving a notice from the Librarian.
9. A student shall not be allowed to borrow the same book again within two days of its return. This rule does not apply to teachers.
10. Any person who loses or damages a book shall be liable to pay at least double its cost. If the book belongs to a set or series, the cost of the entire set may be charged unless replaced.
11. Students may visit the library during free periods. Silence must be maintained at all times; any disturbance may lead to disciplinary action or fine.
12. The library is meant for individuals associated with the academic activities of the college.
13. Reference books, periodicals and magazines, standard dictionaries, encyclopaedias, census reports, and rare books identified by the Library Committee/Principal, shall not be issued to any student.
14. Periodicals are meant for consultation within the library premises only.
15. All books must be returned annually during stock verification (April–May). The Librarian shall report damaged or missing books and prepare a list for write-off.
16. Teachers wishing to retain books during summer vacations must return them at the time of stock checking.
17. Sleeping, smoking, chatting, eating, use of mobile phones, and discussions are strictly prohibited in the library.

Hostel Rules and Regulations

1. Boarders shall sign receipts for furniture and other items issued to them and shall be responsible for any damage to doors, windows, glass panes, furniture, almirahs, fittings, or any other hostel property.
2. Meals shall be served only in the Dining Hall, and cooking in hostel rooms is strictly prohibited.
3. The Hostel Mess shall be run either by a contractor or on a co-operative basis under the supervision of the Mess Committee comprising boarders and the respective Wardens.
4. Mess charges must be paid by the 10th of every month.
5. Boys' hostel gates shall remain open from 5:00 AM to 10:00 PM in summer and from 6:00 AM to 8:00 PM in winter. Gates may be opened at night only in emergencies, and no boarder shall leave the hostel after night attendance.
6. Girls' hostel gates shall remain open from 6:00 AM to 7:30 PM in summer and from 8:00 AM to 6:00 PM in winter. No girl student shall leave the hostel premises without written permission from the Warden.
7. Hostlers shall be responsible for the safety of their belongings. Violation of hostel rules may invite fines, and unattended articles left during vacations may be confiscated.
8. Hostel authorities shall not be responsible for any loss or theft of cash or valuables kept in boarders' rooms.
9. No boarder shall engage in any activity or amusement likely to disturb other boarders.
10. Ragging in the hostel is strictly prohibited. Any student found involved in ragging shall be liable to expulsion from both the hostel and the College.
11. Refundable dues shall be released only after clearance of all pending payments. Claims for refunds must be submitted within six months from the date of leaving the hostel.
12. The College authorities reserve the right to amend or modify hostel rules without prior notice, and the decision of the principal in all matters shall be final and binding.

Rules for Games and Sports

1. Games and sports shall be conducted regularly, and every student is expected to participate actively.
2. Every student shall arrange and maintain the necessary equipment required for the game or sport opted for.
3. College teams shall be constituted after completion of the admission process on the basis of trials and a rigorous selection procedure.
4. Players are advised, in their own interest, to remain punctual and regular in their academic work. Inter-group tournaments in various games shall be organized periodically.
5. Cups, trophies, and prizes shall be awarded to the winning groups and teams.
6. Outstanding players shall be considered for annual awards by the competent authority on the basis of their overall performance in different games and sports.
7. Members of the College teams must report punctually for practice sessions and matches.
8. Any player found indulging in acts of indiscipline within the College shall not be eligible for prizes, certificates, College colours, or participation in games and sports activities.

NCC Rules and Regulations

1. Every enrolled NCC cadet shall undergo two parades of two hours each every week and must attend at least 45 parades in an academic year.
2. A minimum of 75% attendance in parades shall be mandatory for eligibility in NCC activities and examinations.
3. Enrolled cadets shall also be required to attend NCC camps as prescribed by the authorities.
4. Uniforms issued by the College must be returned to the officer-in-charge at the end of the academic session, failing which permission to appear in the University Examinations may be withheld.
5. 'B' and 'C' Certificate Examinations shall be conducted annually for cadets undergoing the 2nd and 3rd year of NCC training respectively.
6. Any cadet found guilty of misbehaviour or misconduct during NCC activities may be debarred from appearing in the University Examinations.

Attendance in Lieu of Participation in Games and Co-curricular Activities

Any candidate participating in games, cultural programmes, and other co-curricular activities with the prior approval of the principal shall, for the purpose of condoning deficiency in attendance arising out of such participation, be treated as present on all working days during the period of absence. Such concession shall not exceed 15 working days in a semester programme, subject to a maximum of 30 working days in an academic year. The concession shall be applicable in the following cases:

1. Participation in International or All India Competitions as a representative of the State, organized by agencies recognized by the Board of Sports and Youth Welfare.
2. Participation in Inter-University Competitions conducted under the auspices of a University or any other recognized institution as a member of the University team.
3. Participation in Inter-College Competitions organized by the University as a member of the team representing the participating institution.
4. Participation in activities of NCC, NSS, and National Integration Samiti as a member of a recognized institution.
5. Participation in coaching camps or rehearsals prior to representing the State or University in National, All

India, or Inter-University Competitions.

6. Participation in mountaineering, hiking, trekking, skiing, rock-climbing, or similar activities organized under the auspices of the State Government or the University as a member of an affiliated or recognized institution.

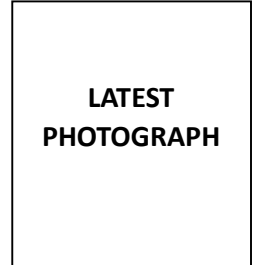
